


## Asian carp sighting



## Algonquin Land Claim - Recent (if rare) update from the Government

At a July 2015 meeting in Toronto with senior staff from the Ministries of Aboriginal Affairs, and Natural Resources and Forestry, FOCA was informed that **there are still 5-10 (or more) years of significant work ahead on this land claim**, between the current Agreement in Principle (AIP), and a final, signed Treaty. This work, including consultations on land disposition, access to Crown Lands and other matters, hinges firstly on the Algonquins of Ontario signing off on the whole AIP. Learn more, here:




## Action still required to eliminate toxic antibacterials

With no action seen to date, FOCA and dozens of other community groups have sent an urgent appeal to the Minister of the Environment this week, seeking Federal action on the Environment Canada Assessment Report on Triclosan.

The 2012 report had proposed that Triclosan should be declared 'toxic' under the Canadian Environmental Protection Act. Triclosan - which has been detected in drinking water, breast milk and household dust - has been shown to harm wildlife living in rivers and lakes. Learn more, and read the new appeal, here:
