### Dock Permit issues: time to add your voice!

Changes to the dock permitting process are in place, likely for the whole of the 2016 season, if not longer. FOCA has yet to hear about any plans from the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry (MNRF) to amend this process.

*"The single most important step a parent can take is to ensure that a Cottage Sharing Agreement is developed during their lifetimes with the children as part of the overall cottage succession plan," says Lilloco. "It's not lack of interest, capital gains tax or other financial pressures that result in most family cottages going up for sale, it's a consequence of friction within the family that arises from sharing ownership and usage."*




## Fire Season

## Traps near Trails

In December 2014, a family dog was killed by a baited kill-trap just steps off a public snowmobile trail on Crown Land in cottage country. Currently, traps can be legally set all year round on trails, including on Crown Land, in Provincial Parks, in lakes, ponds and beaver dams, and beside roadways; there are no minimum setbacks and no requirement to warn the public that the traps are there.


## Property Tax Re-assessments rolling out





Figure 2. Average of 1995-2010 data showing decreasing water total phosphorus along the Kawartha Lakes upstream from Orillia, ON. Lake numbers reflect a flow from west to east. For more details, visit: <https://klsa.wordpress.com/published-material/>



May 11, 2016 - FOCA attended a meeting of the **Lake Simcoe Stewardship Network** for important updates on key activities ongoing in the watershed, including a **5-year Review of Lake Monitoring** (PDF, 54 pages) from the Ministry of the Environment and Climate Change, Water Soldier eradication efforts, invasive species detection tips from the **Ontario Invasive Plant Council**, and a profile of the Lake Simcoe Region Conservation Authority's Stewardship Prioritization Mapping Tool.

May 14, 2016 - FOCA was pleased to attend and be part of the annual **Coalition of Haliburton Property Owners Association** Lake Stewards meeting in Stanhope. (see **image at right**) There are great things happening in the region, and local lake associations are at the centre of the action!


