- Strengthening partnerships with stakeholders to ensure Ontario's waterfront residents have a voice in decisions impacting their communities.

We recognize the diverse challenges facing waterfront communities-from environmental preservation to infrastructure maintenance-and will continue to advocate for solutions that benefit our members.


As we look ahead, I am confident that together we will continue to build a vibrant and resilient cottage community.
